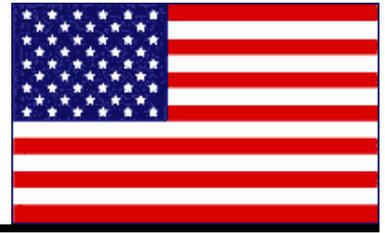

WHO MAY APPLY TO THIS ANNOUNCEMENT:

- Any US Citizen

MAJOR DUTIES:

Performs preliminary overviews, data entry and proper routing of submitted VA and non-VA research proposals in a timely manner to ensure appropriate deadlines are met. Ensures required subcommittee reviews are scheduled, assisting in the detection and correction of deficiencies, and ensuring that all required approvals are obtained. Creates presentation materials by identifying which studies can be reviewed, assigns committee and/or subcommittee reviewers and coordinates schedules of committee and/or subcommittee members using email, phone and person-to-person contact to arrange meeting times. Assembles IRB review binders, photocopies meeting materials, distributes binders and primary reviewer materials to attendees and generates agendas. Distributes the appropriate review forms for various committees and subcommittees and provides necessary follow-up to bring these reviews to closure. Enters data relating to committee membership, funding sources, personnel, and submitted paperwork for new and initial projects into the appropriate Research Service databases. Contacts other Research Service staff regarding questions or potential problems with submitted paperwork and ensures that follow-up occurs in a timely manner with IRB chairs and members.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

Eligibility: U.S. Office of Personnel Management Qualification Standards Handbook for GS-301 series applies and may be reviewed in the Human Resources Management Service office.

Specialized Experience: One (1) year experience that equipped the applicant with the particular knowledge, skills, and abilities (KSA's) to perform successfully the duties of the position. Includes working on an institutional review board as an IRB coordinator, study coordinator, or similar positions. Duties include, but are not limited to, preparing IRB packets, organizing meetings, preparing IRB minutes, and working with scientists and support staff to ensure each submission is timely, accurate and complete. To be creditable, specialized experience must have been equivalent to at least the next lower grade level.

Substitution of Education for Experience: If using education as a substitute for experience, please submit a copy of your college transcripts with application packet. **GS-7:** One (1) full year of graduate level education or superior academic achievement; **GS-9:** Master's or equivalent graduate degree or 2 full years of progressively higher level graduate education leading to such a degree or LL.B. or J.D., if related.

BASIS OF RATING: (Knowledge, Skills, Abilities (KSAs))

On a separate sheet of paper, provide a written, detailed response to each of the KSAs. Failure to respond to rating factors will result in applicant not being referred for the position:

1. Experience working with an Institutional Review Board to protect human subjects enrolled in a research project.
2. Experience tracking the status of research protocols for approval requirements and ongoing research protocols.
3. Experience assuring research protocols follow institutional, state, and federal guidelines.
4. Experience in facilitating communication, both oral and written, between the Institutional Review Board and the scientific staff conducting the research protocol.

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT:

Applicants without prior federal service will be appointed at step one of the grade

Although the duty station is shown in this announcement, it may be necessary to utilize the selected person's services at a different location within the Portland VA Medical Center commuting area if conditions require it in the future

Under Executive Order 11935, only United States citizens and nationals (residents of American Samoa and Swains Island) may compete for civil service jobs. Agencies are permitted to hire noncitizens only in very limited circumstances

where there are no qualified citizens available for the position.

If you are a male born after December 31, 1959, and are at least 18 years of age, civil service employment law (5 U.S.C. 3328) requires that you must register with the Selective Service System, unless you meet certain exemptions.

A security clearance and a favorable suitability determination are required. Misconduct in prior employment, criminal, dishonest or disgraceful conduct, habitual use of intoxicating beverages, abuse of narcotics, drugs or other controlled substances, or reasonable doubt of loyalty to the United States are examples of reasons an offer of employment may be denied.

Public transit subsidy benefits are available. Carpooling assistance is provided. However, single occupancy parking is limited on main Portland campus.

This is a developmental position. If selected below the target level, employee may be promoted without further competition upon satisfactory completion of qualification and eligibility requirements.

 - c. VA letter of service-connected disability rating dated 1991 or later.
4. SF-50, Notification of Personnel Action (if applying as a current or former federal employee).
5. Narrative statement relating to all of the KSAs. Candidates **must** submit a narrative statement on a separate page(s) with specific responses to all of the knowledge, skills, and abilities (KSAs) in this announcement. Failure to submit your narrative response to all of the KSAs will result in the applicant not being referred for the position.
6. A copy of your college transcripts (Optional unless education is required).
