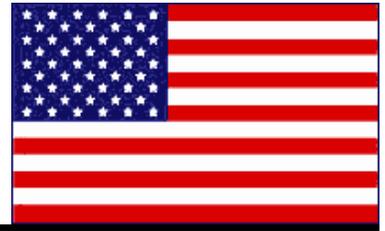

WHO MAY APPLY TO THIS ANNOUNCEMENT:

- Any US Citizen

MAJOR DUTIES:

The incumbent interprets requests or instructions for medical or health care personnel. Explains procedures, positions patients for desired results, and cushions and shields patients as appropriate. Sets up and adjusts specialized equipment with multiple features that require precise patient positioning to operate correctly. Performs a range of diagnostic support duties such as taking, recording and reporting to supervisor deviations in vital signs, taking specimens, and labeling specimens for the laboratory. Provides clerical and administrative support to the unit. Maintains patient's records/charts. Receives all telephone calls and visitors.

THIS POSITION IS IN THE BARGAINING UNIT

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

Eligibility: U.S. Office of Personnel Management Qualification Standards Handbook for GS-640 series applies and may be reviewed in the Human Resources Management Service office.

Specialized Experience: GS-5: One (1) full year equivalent to at least GS-4; **GS-6:** One (1) full year equivalent to at least GS-5. Specialized experience is experience that equipped the applicant with the particular knowledge, skills, and abilities to perform successfully the duties of the position, and that is typically in or related to the work of the position to be filled. Experience may include work as a study coordinator or research assistant working with patients on a research study in a medical center or hospital. Duties may include, but are not limited to, consenting patients, performing standard procedures, inputting data into databases, analyzing data, writing papers, and assisting with grant preparation.

Substitution of Education for Experience: If using education as a substitute for experience, please submit a copy of your college transcripts with application packet. Applicants for such research positions can be considered qualified for GS-5 if they possess a four year course of study above high school leading to a bachelor's degree with courses related to the occupation. Applicants for such research positions can be considered qualified for GS-6 if they possess at least one full year of graduate education.

BASIS OF RATING: (Knowledge, Skills, Abilities (KSAs))

On a separate sheet of paper, provide a written, detailed response to each of the KSAs. Failure to respond to rating factors will result in applicant not being referred for the position:

1. Effectiveness in organizing multiple tasks and setting priorities.
2. Skill in using personal computers and software programs such as Word, Excel, Outlook, Vista Imaging, and CPRS.
3. Ability to formulate, gather and track data for reports.
4. Ability to update and manage complex databases, prepare complex written reports in correct format and relay complex information to study participants.
5. Skill in interpersonal relations and diplomacy in dealing with patients, employees and visitors.
6. Capacity to work in a busy, changing environment with minimum oversight.

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT:

Applicants without prior federal service will be appointed at step one of the grade. Although the duty station is shown in this announcement, it may be necessary to utilize the selected person's services at a different location within the Portland VA Medical Center commuting area if conditions require it in the future. Under Executive Order 11935, only United States citizens and nationals (residents of American Samoa and Swains Island) may compete for civil service jobs. Agencies are permitted to hire noncitizens only in very limited circumstances where there are no qualified citizens available for the position.

If you are a male born after December 31, 1959, and are at least 18 years of age, civil service employment law

(5 U.S.C. 3328) requires that you must register with the Selective Service System, unless you meet certain exemptions. A security clearance and a favorable suitability determination are required. Misconduct in prior employment, criminal, dishonest or disgraceful conduct, habitual use of intoxicating beverages, abuse of narcotics, drugs or other controlled substances, or reasonable doubt of loyalty to the United States are examples of reasons an offer of employment may be denied.

Public transit subsidy benefits are available. Carpooling assistance is provided. However, single occupancy parking is limited on main Portland campus.

This is a developmental position. If selected below the target level, employee may be promoted without further competition upon satisfactory completion of qualification and eligibility requirements.

A drug test may be required for an applicant who is tentatively selected.

A pre-employment physical examination will be required for an applicant who is tentatively selected.

Applicants appointed to direct patient care positions must be proficient in spoken and written English as required by 38 USC 7402(d) and 7407(d).

 - c. VA letter of service-connected disability rating dated 1991 or later.
4. SF-50, Notification of Personnel Action (if applying as a current or former federal employee).
5. Narrative statement relating to all of the KSAs. Candidates **must** submit a narrative statement on a separate page(s) with specific responses to all of the knowledge, skills, and abilities (KSAs) in this announcement. Failure to submit your narrative response to all of the KSAs will result in the applicant not being referred for the position.
6. A copy of your college transcripts (Optional unless education is required).
