MAJOR DUTIES:

The incumbent is responsible for functioning as an LPN in Specialty Clinics. As a Lead LPN assigns staffing, coordinates orientation of new employees, maintains competency tracking and insures on-going training/learning needs are met. Incumbent identifies and responds to process/performance issues requiring immediate attention, and reports performance and conduct issues to supervisor for appropriate follow up.
