

WHO MAY APPLY TO THIS ANNOUNCEMENT:

- Career or career conditional employees and permanent Title 38 employees of the Portland VA Medical Center eligible under the interchange Agreement. Included are permanent employees of the Willamette National Cemetery, Regional Office, Veterans Outreach Center and Veteran’s Canteen.
- Any US Citizen
- **First consideration date 03/16/09.** After the first consideration date, applicants will then be referred in intervals. If the position is filled before the closing date the vacancy will be closed.

MAJOR DUTIES:

The incumbent will service as an agent for supervising physicians. Orders written by him/her are to be considered as coming from the supervising physician. Duties include, but are not limited the incumbent being responsible for initial screening of patients in the outpatient clinic. A screening may include history, physical exams, ordering laboratory tests, MRI’s CT scans and x-rays, electrocardiograms, EMG’s and other routine diagnostic tests. May institute appropriate treatment for minor surgical problems. Prescriptive privileges will follow the guidelines enumerated in VACO Circular 40-84-112. The incumbent prescribing drugs for inpatients is restricted to routine medications and DEA Class II, III, and IV controlled substances. The incumbent will initiate evaluations and therapy for patients as outlined in their physician assistant practice description on file in Surgical Service and may write prescriptions for medications as commensurate with their VA prescriptive privileges. Assists in the screening of in-hospital consultations received, may be written or verbal and helps determine appropriate disposition. Performs procedures such as simple laceration suturing; venipuncture; arteropuncture, etc. Conducts pre-operative workup for surgery patients. Conducts surgery patient and family teaching/education to provide continuity of care.

THIS POSITION IS IN THE BARGAINING UNIT

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

Eligibility: Department of Veterans Affairs Qualifications Standards (VA Handbook 5005, Part II, Appendix G8) for AD/VN-603 series applies and may be reviewed in the Human Resources Management Service Office.

- Current active license as a Physician’s Assistant in the State of Oregon.
- Certification by the National Commission on Certification of Physician’s Assistants (NCCPA).
- Graduation from a PA program certified by the ARC-PA

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT:

- Although the duty station is shown in this announcement, it may be necessary to utilize the selected person's services at a different location within the Portland VA Medical Center commuting area if conditions require it in the future
- Under Executive Order 11935, only United States citizens and nationals (residents of American Samoa and Swains Island) may compete for civil service jobs. Agencies are permitted to hire noncitizens only in very limited circumstances where there are no qualified citizens available for the position.
- All information submitted to this VA Medical Center is subject to verification by VetPro.
- If you are a male born after December 31, 1959, and are at least 18 years of age, civil service employment law (5 U.S.C. 3328) requires that you must register with the Selective Service System, unless you meet certain exemptions.
- A security clearance and a favorable suitability determination are required. Misconduct in prior employment, criminal, dishonest or disgraceful conduct, habitual use of intoxicating beverages, abuse of narcotics, drugs or other controlled substances, or reasonable doubt of loyalty to the United States are examples of reasons an offer of employment may be denied.
- Public transit subsidy benefits are available. Carpooling assistance is provided. However, single occupancy parking is limited on main Portland campus.

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- Eligible employees may be non-competitively reassigned to fill this position as an exception to merit promotion.
- A drug test may be required for an applicant who is tentatively selected.
- A pre-employment physical examination will be required for an applicant who is tentatively selected.
- Applicants appointed to direct patient care positions must be proficient in spoken and written English as required by 38 USC 7402(d) and 7407(d).

APPLICANT'S PLEASE NOTE:
