

WHO MAY APPLY TO THIS ANNOUNCEMENT:

- Career or career conditional employees and permanent Title 38 employees of the Portland VA Medical Center eligible under the interchange Agreement. Included are permanent employees of the Willamette National Cemetery, Regional Office, Veterans Outreach Center and Veteran's Canteen.
- Any US Citizen

MAJOR DUTIES:

The individual in this assignment spends the majority of his/her time working as an Occupational Therapist providing therapy in the homes of Home Based Primary Care patients. Independently solves complex problems related to Occupational Therapy, and adapts and modifies treatment plans, activities, and procedures to meet the needs of patients with complex disorders. Attends interdisciplinary team conferences and collaborates with HBPC team in developing appropriate care plans for HBPC patients. Serves as subject matter expert in the specialty area as a consultant to Rehab and Long Term Care and Home Based Primary Care staff in evaluating and treating patients in the specialty area. Serves as a mentor to other therapists evaluating and treating patients in the specialty or program area. Provides in-service and clinical training programs in specialty or program area.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

Eligibility: Department of Veterans Affairs Qualifications Standards (VA Handbook 5005, Part II, Appendix G14) for GS-631 series applies and may be reviewed in the Human Resources Management Service Office.

Basic Requirements :

Citizenship: Citizen of the United States.

Education:

- **Degree or Certificate.** Graduation from a baccalaureate degree program in occupational therapy or a post-baccalaureate certificate program accredited by the Accreditation Council for Occupational Therapy Education. Verification of recognized degree and certificate programs may be obtained from the [Occupational Therapy Association website](#).
- **Foreign Graduates.** Graduates of foreign occupational therapy training programs also meet the education requirement if they have graduated from a degree or equivalent program recognized by the AOTA. For information about verification of recognized programs see paragraph above.

Certification:

- Possession of written documentation that the individual has passed the Certification Examination for Occupational Therapists Registered OTR, which is administered by the National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy.
- Appointing officials may approve the appointment of candidates who have ever had their certification revoked, suspended, denied, restricted, limited, or issued/placed in a probationary status provided they currently have full and unrestricted certification.

Specialized Experience:

GS-11: Requires the equivalent of 1 year of experience at the next lower grade level which demonstrates knowledges, skills, abilities and other characteristics that are directly related to the duties of the position to be filled. Individuals in this assignment spend a majority of their time working in a specialty or special program area. This includes:

- Independently solving complex problems related to occupational therapy, adapting and modifying treatment plans, activities, and procedures to meet the needs of patients with complex disabilities.
- Serving as a subject matter expert in the specialty or program area and as a consultant to occupational therapy staff

- and other facility staff in evaluating and treating patients in the specialty area.
- Serving as a mentor to other therapists evaluating and treating patients in the specialty or program area
- Providing in-service and clinical training in the specialty or program area.
- Teaching at the affiliated college or university in the specialty or program area

Substitution of Education for Experience: **GS-11** - 3 years of progressively higher level graduate education leading to a Ph.D. degree or Ph.D. or equivalent doctoral degree

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT:

This is an Excepted Appointment. Excepted service positions have been excepted from the requirements of the competitive service by law, Executive Order, or by OPM regulation (5 USC 2103 and 5 CFR part 213). Public law No. 108-170 converts this occupational series from the competitive civil service to the Hybrid Title 38 employment system.

Applicants without prior federal service will be appointed at step one of the grade

Although the duty station is shown in this announcement, it may be necessary to utilize the selected person's services at a different location within the Portland VA Medical Center commuting area if conditions require it in the future

Under Executive Order 11935, only United States citizens and nationals (residents of American Samoa and Swains Island) may compete for civil service jobs. Agencies are permitted to hire noncitizens only in very limited circumstances where there are no qualified citizens available for the position.

All information submitted to this VA Medical Center is subject to verification by VetPro.

If you are a male born after December 31, 1959, and are at least 18 years of age, civil service employment law (5 U.S.C. 3328) requires that you must register with the Selective Service System, unless you meet certain exemptions.

A security clearance and a favorable suitability determination are required. Misconduct in prior employment, criminal, dishonest or disgraceful conduct, habitual use of intoxicating beverages, abuse of narcotics, drugs or other controlled substances, or reasonable doubt of loyalty to the United States are examples of reasons an offer of employment may be denied.

Public transit subsidy benefits are available. Carpooling assistance is provided. However, single occupancy parking is limited on main Portland campus.

Eligible employees may be non-competitively reassigned to fill this position as an exception to merit promotion.

Applicants selected for this position may be appointed to a temporary appointment, NTE 13 months, pending completion of boarding process.

A drug test may be required for an applicant who is tentatively selected.

A pre-employment physical examination will be required for an applicant who is tentatively selected.

Applicants appointed to direct patient care positions must be proficient in spoken and written English as required by 38 USC 7402(d) and 7407(d).
