WHO MAY APPLY TO THIS ANNOUNCEMENT:

- Career or career conditional employees and permanent Title 38 employees of the Portland VA Medical Center eligible under the interchange Agreement.
- Any US Citizen

2 Full-time positions

MAJOR DUTIES:

The physician must be Board Certified/Board Prepared in Emergency Medicine. Each physician will participate in attending rotation. Beyond the clinical responsibilities, this physician will be involved in the education and training of medical students and house staff with academic affiliation with Oregon Health Science University (OHSU) residents. Selected physician will also conduct scholarly activities.

THIS POSITION IS IN THE BARGAINING UNIT

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

<u>Eligibility</u>: Department of Veterans Affairs Qualifications Standards (VA Handbook 5005, Part II, Appendix G2) for AD/VM-602 series applies and may be reviewed in the Human Resources Management Service Office.

- Must be a citizen of the United States.
- Must have a Degree of doctor of medicine or an equivalent degree resulting from a course of education in medicine or osteopathic medicine.
- Must provide evidence of an active, current, full and unrestricted license to practice Medicine or Surgery in a State, Territory or Commonwealth of the U.S. or the District of Columbia.
- Must be Board Certified/Board Prepared in Emergency Medicine.
- Experience in Occupational Medicine is preferred, but not required.

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT:

- This is an Excepted Appointment. Excepted service positions have been excepted from the requirements
 of the competitive service by law, Executive Order, or by OPM regulation (5 USC 2103 and 5 CFR part 213).
 Public law No. 108-170 converts this occupational series from the competitive civil service to the Hybrid Title 38
 employment system.
- Applicants without prior federal service will be appointed at step one of the grade.
- Although the duty station is shown in this announcement, it may be necessary to utilize the selected person's services at a different location within the Portland VA Medical Center commuting area if conditions require it in the future
- Under Executive Order 11935, only United States citizens and nationals (residents of American Samoa and Swains Island) may compete for civil service jobs. Agencies are permitted to hire noncitizens only in very limited circumstances where there are no qualified citizens available for the position.
- All information submitted to this VA Medical Center is subject to verification by VetPro.
- If you are a male born after December 31, 1959, and are at least 18 years of age, civil service employment

- (5 U.S.C. 3328) requires that you must register with the Selective Service System, unless you meet certain exemptions.
- A security clearance and a favorable suitability determination are required. Misconduct in prior employment, criminal, dishonest or disgraceful conduct, habitual use of intoxicating beverages, abuse of narcotics, drugs or other controlled substances, or reasonable doubt of loyalty to the United States are examples of reasons an offer of employment may be denied.
- Public transit subsidy benefits are available. Carpooling assistance is provided. However, single occupancy parking is limited on main Portland campus.
- Eligible employees may be non-competitively reassigned to fill this position as an exception to merit promotion.
- Applicants selected for this position may be appointed to a temporary appointment, NTE 13 months, pending completion of boarding process.
- Relocation expenses may be authorized.
- Relocation incentive may be authorized.
- Recruitment incentive may be authorized.
- A drug test may be required for an applicant who is tentatively selected.
- A pre-employment physical examination will be required for an applicant who is tentatively selected.
- Applicants appointed to direct patient care positions must be proficient in spoken and written English as required by 38 USC 7402(d) and 7407(d).

 - b. <u>SF-15, Application for 10-point Veteran Preference</u> (December 2004 version or later)
 - c. VA letter or DOD documentation of service-connected disability rating dated 1991 or later.
- 5. SF-50, Notification of Personnel Action (if applying as a current or former federal employee).
- 6. Copies of all current licenses, registrations, or certifications (applicable to job).
- 7. A copy of your college transcripts (Optional unless education is required).

All application packets must be received in Human Resources by Close of Business (COB) on 08/16/2010 for first consideration, or COB on 09/15/2010 for second consideration. This position is Open until 09/30/2010.
