

WHO MAY APPLY TO THIS ANNOUNCEMENT:

- Career or career conditional employees and permanent Title 38 employees of the Portland VA Medical Center eligible under the interchange Agreement. Included are permanent employees of the Willamette National Cemetery, Regional Office, Veterans Outreach Center and Veteran's Canteen.
- Any US Citizen

MAJOR DUTIES:

Has direct administrative and professional supervision of clinicians located at the Substance Abuse Treatment Program (SATP)-Portland, PTSD Clinical Team (PCT)-Portland, and other clinics as assigned. Has line and staff authority for resource allocations within programs noted above. Ensures efficient operation of programs noted above. Oversees program evaluations and performance improvement projects. The incumbent has the supervisory responsibilities noted above, manages the budget for clinical programs, represents Psychology or the Mental Health Division on hospital committees as assigned, interacts with HR in matters of hiring and disciplinary action, and otherwise has primary responsibility for all aspects of administration both within designated programs and in the relationship of these programs to PVAMC. The incumbent reports to the Clinical and Administrative Directors of the Mental Health & Neurosciences Division, but largely operates on a day-to-day basis in an independent manner, with full responsibility to keep the division leadership apprised of activities and any issues in need of close collaboration.

THIS POSITION IS EXCLUDED FROM THE BARGAINING UNIT

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

Eligibility: Department of Veterans Affairs Qualifications Standards (VA Handbook 5005, Part II, Appendix G18) applies and may be reviewed in the Human Resources Management Service Office.

Basic Requirements:

- Must be a citizen of the United States.
- Doctoral degree in psychology from APA Accredited Graduate Program in an area of training consistent with the assignment for which the applicant is to be employed.
- Internship in professional psychology accredited by the American Psychological Association.
- Professional Psychology Licensure: States, License Numbers, dates of original licensure. A psychologist must hold a full, current and unrestricted license to practice psychology at the doctoral level in a State, Territory, Commonwealth of the US, or the District of Columbia. The secretary may waive the requirement of licensure for a period not to exceed two years from the date of employment on the condition that such a psychologist provide care only under the supervision of a psychologist who is licensed.

Experience: There must be two or more years of clinical experience comparable to what one would get in a VA setting, either by post-doctoral employment or two years of employment as a psychologist. A psychologist must be licensed at the GS 13 level. In addition the candidate must demonstrate the following KSAs:

1. Knowledge of, and ability to apply, advanced professional psychological theories and techniques to the full range of patient populations.
2. Ability to provide professional advice and consultation in areas related to professional psychology and behavioral health.
3. Knowledge of clinical research literature.
4. Ability to provide supervision in areas related to behavioral health and social services provision in order to accomplish the organizational goals and objectives.
5. Ability to provide fair, principled and decisive leadership for a work environment that promotes shared

accountability.

BASIS OF RATING: (Knowledge, Skills, Abilities (KSAs))

On a separate sheet of paper, provide a written, detailed response to each of the KSAs. Failure to respond to rating factors will result in applicant not being referred for the position:

1. Ability to effectively coordinate and supervise a multidisciplinary staff.
2. Knowledge of Substance Abuse Treatment and Post Traumatic Stress Disorder programs to include principles, processes and policies.
3. Ability to effectively communicate and collaborate across patient care lines to ensure quality of care.
4. Ability to exercise ingenuity, inventiveness and original thinking in devising innovative solutions to the complexity of issues in a multi-service health care setting.
5. Understanding of clinical issues that afflict veterans with substance use disorders and PTSD.
6. Understanding of clinical issues of veterans serving in Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom.

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT:

This is an Excepted Appointment. Excepted service positions have been excepted from the requirements of the competitive service by law, Executive Order, or by OPM regulation (5 USC 2103 and 5 CFR part 213). Public law No. 108-170 converts this occupational series from the competitive civil service to the Hybrid Title 38 employment system.

Applicants without prior federal service will be appointed at step one of the grade

Although the duty station is shown in this announcement, it may be necessary to utilize the selected person's services at a different location within the Portland VA Medical Center commuting area if conditions require it in the future

Under Executive Order 11935, only United States citizens and nationals (residents of American Samoa and Swains Island) may compete for civil service jobs. Agencies are permitted to hire noncitizens only in very limited circumstances where there are no qualified citizens available for the position.

All information submitted to this VA Medical Center is subject to verification by VetPro.

If you are a male born after December 31, 1959, and are at least 18 years of age, civil service employment law (5 U.S.C. 3328) requires that you must register with the Selective Service System, unless you meet certain exemptions.

A security clearance and a favorable suitability determination are required. Misconduct in prior employment, criminal, dishonest or disgraceful conduct, habitual use of intoxicating beverages, abuse of narcotics, drugs or other controlled substances, or reasonable doubt of loyalty to the United States are examples of reasons an offer of employment may be denied.

Public transit subsidy benefits are available. Carpooling assistance is provided. However, single occupancy parking is limited on main Portland campus.

Relocation incentive may be authorized.

Recruitment incentive may be authorized.

Eligible employees may be non-competitively reassigned to fill this position as an exception to merit promotion.

A drug test may be required for an applicant who is tentatively selected.

A pre-employment physical examination will be required for an applicant who is tentatively selected.

Applicants appointed to direct patient care positions must be proficient in spoken and written English as required by 38 USC 7402(d) and 7407(d).
