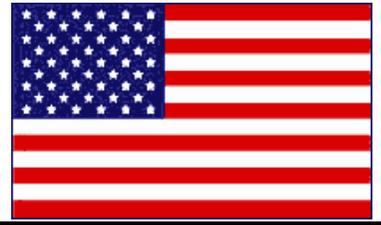

WHO MAY APPLY TO THIS ANNOUNCEMENT:

- Career or career conditional employees and permanent Title 38 employees and permanent Title 38 Hybrid employees of the Portland VA Medical Center eligible under the interchange Agreement. Included are permanent employees of the Willamette National Cemetery, Regional Office, Veterans Outreach Center and Veteran's Canteen.
- Career or career conditional employees and permanent Title 38 employees of other VA facilities.
- Applicants with competitive status outside the VA i.e., those with transfer or reinstatement eligibility.
- Veterans who are preference eligibles or who have been separated from the armed forces under honorable conditions after 3 or more years of continuous active service.
- Employees covered under the provision of the inter-agency Career Transition Plan (ICTAP) and Career Transition Assistance Plan (CTAP) (displaced VA Employees) eligibles will be given priority consideration for vacancies within the **local commuting area** for which they are well qualified. Applicants requesting this consideration must attach appropriate proof of the ICTAP eligibility with their application.

MAJOR DUTIES:

The incumbent is responsible for timely and accurate collection, accessioning, processing and distribution of laboratory specimens. Processes specimens into the laboratory according to laboratory procedure. Responsible for storage and preparation of specimens for send-out testing. Serves as contact person for referral laboratories. Answers or directs routine inquires from telephone calls or visitors. Collects and processes biohazard waste for disposal. Provides teaching and guidance to other health technicians, students and volunteers. Monitors inventory and replenishes laboratory supplies. Performs daily, weekly and monthly, maintenance on designated laboratory equipment. Maintains filing systems for anatomic pathology reports, microscope slides, paraffin blocks and worksheets. Prepares cytology smears and cell blocks. Maintains tissue storage cabinets and autopsy tissue storage in an organized manner. Acts as an autopsy assistant. Cleans and maintains the autopsy suite and tissue examination room. Performs other duties as assigned.

THIS POSITION IS IN THE BARGAINING UNIT

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

Eligibility: U.S. Office of Personnel Management Qualification Standards Handbook for GS-640 series applies and may be reviewed in the Human Resources Management Service office. Regulatory requirements such as "time-in-grade" and "time after competitive appointment" are applicable.

General Experience: GS-3/4: Six months of general experience in any type of work that demonstrates the applicant's ability to perform the work of the position or experience that provided a familiarity with the subject matter or processes of the broad subject area of the occupation. **GS-5:** Generally, not applicable.

Specialized Experience: GS-3: None. **GS-4:** Six (6) months of specialized experience equivalent to the GS-3 grade level in Federal Service. **GS-5:** One (1) year of specialized experience equivalent to the GS-4 grade level. Experience must have equipped the applicant with the particular knowledge, skills, and abilities to perform successfully the duties of the position and that are typically in or related to the work of the position.

Substitution of Education for Experience: Successfully completed post-high school education is qualifying for grades GS-3 through GS-5. This education must have been obtained in an accredited business or technical school, junior college, college or university for which high school graduation or the equivalent is the normal prerequisite. **GS-3:** Successful completion of one (1) year of study that included medical, health, or related fields. **GS-4:** Successful completion of two years of study that included at least 12 semester hours in subjects related to the position. **GS-5:** Successful completion of a four-year course of study above the high school level leading to a bachelor's degree with a major study of at least 24 semester hours in subjects directly related to the position. **If using education as a substitute for experience, please submit a copy of your college transcripts with application packet.**

BASIS OF RATING: (Knowledge, Skills, Abilities (KSAs))

On a separate sheet of paper, provide a written, detailed response to each of the KSAs. Failure to respond to rating factors will result in applicant not being referred for the position:

1. Ability to process specimens into the laboratory using the hospital computer following laboratory procedures.
2. Ability to check specimens and requisitions received in laboratory for accuracy of information on both specimen labels and accompanying requisitions.
3. Ability to follow written instructions and record data as appropriate.
4. Knowledge of human anatomy sufficient to act as assistant for performance of autopsies.
5. Ability to provide assistance for performance of autopsies to include moving bodies with assistance of mechanical lift.
6. Ability to communicate clearly and effectively in a professional manner with other members of the laboratory, medical center employees, patients, and visitors
7. Knowledge of safety procedures and precautions to perform collection and processing of laboratory biohazard waste.

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT:

Although the duty station is shown in this announcement, it may be necessary to utilize the selected person's services at a different location within the Portland VA Medical Center commuting area if conditions require it in the future

Applicants without prior federal service will be appointed at step one of the grade

Eligible employees may be non-competitively reassigned to fill this position as an exception to merit promotion.

Under Executive Order 11935, only United States citizens and nationals (residents of American Samoa and Swains Island) may compete for civil service jobs. Agencies are permitted to hire noncitizens only in very limited circumstances where there are no qualified citizens available for the position.

If you are a male born after December 31, 1959, and are at least 18 years of age, civil service employment law (5 U.S.C. 3328) requires that you must register with the Selective Service System, unless you meet certain exemptions.

A security clearance and a favorable suitability determination are required. Misconduct in prior employment, criminal, dishonest or disgraceful conduct, habitual use of intoxicating beverages, abuse of narcotics, drugs or other controlled substances, or reasonable doubt of loyalty to the United States are examples of reasons an offer of employment may be denied.

Public transit subsidy benefits are available. Carpooling assistance is provided. However, single occupancy parking is limited on main Portland campus.

This is a developmental position. If selected below the target level, employee may be promoted without further competition upon satisfactory completion of qualification and eligibility requirements.

A drug test may be required for an applicant who is tentatively selected.

A pre-employment physical examination will be required for an applicant who is tentatively selected.

Applicants appointed to direct patient care positions must be proficient in spoken and written English as required by 38 USC 7402(d) and 7407(d).

This agency provides reasonable accommodations to applicants with disabilities. If you need a reasonable accommodation for any part of the application and hiring process, please notify the agency. The decision on granting reasonable accommodation will be on a case-by-case basis
