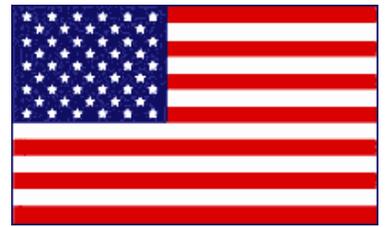

WHO MAY APPLY TO THIS ANNOUNCEMENT:

- Career or career conditional employees and permanent Title 38 employees of the Portland VA Medical Center eligible under the interchange Agreement. Included are permanent employees of the Willamette National Cemetery, Regional Office, Veterans Outreach Center and Veteran's Canteen.

MAJOR DUTIES:

The incumbent serves as the primary administrative support person for the Primary Care Division. Performs work in direct support of the Primary Care Division to include providing clerical, assistant, or technician level support. Performs work in support of general management and/or program analysis functions and provides assistance to managers in performing analysis and/or evaluation of operating program characteristics. Obtains, organizes, files, and receives reports, correspondence, and numerical data for use in preparing status reports, briefings, and presentations. Analyzes workflow to determine potential problem areas and makes recommendations to correct these areas and to improve coordination between the various units and/or offices.

THIS POSITION IS IN THE BARGAINING UNIT

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

Eligibility: U.S. Office of Personnel Management Qualification Standards Handbook for GS-303 series applies and may be reviewed in the Human Resources Management Service office. Regulatory requirements such as "time-in-grade" and "time after competitive appointment" are applicable.

Specialized Experience: One (1) year of specialized experience is required that has equipped the applicant with the particular knowledge, skills, and abilities (KSA's) to perform successfully the duties of the position and that is typically in or related to the position to be filled. To be creditable, specialized experience must have been equivalent to the next lower grade level in Federal Service.

BASIS OF RATING: (Knowledge, Skills, Abilities (KSAs))

On a separate sheet of paper, provide a written, detailed response to each of the KSAs. Failure to respond to rating factors will result in applicant not being referred for the position:

1. Understanding of Primary Care administrative procedures.
2. Ability to communicate verbally and in writing with a wide variety of local, regional, and national administrative and clinical staff, to include the orientation of new providers.
3. Knowledge and ability to work under pressure, use sound judgment, organize, prioritize, meet requirements, and manage deadlines in a responsible and professional manner.
4. Skill and familiarity with the credentialing and privileging processes within the Portland VA Medical Center.
5. Proficient ability to utilize software programs such as Microsoft Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and Outlook'

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT:

Although the duty station is shown in this announcement, it may be necessary to utilize the selected person's services at a different location within the Portland VA Medical Center commuting area if conditions require it in the future

Eligible employees may be non-competitively reassigned to fill this position as an exception to merit promotion.

Public transit subsidy benefits are available. Carpooling assistance is provided. However, single occupancy parking is limited on main Portland campus.
