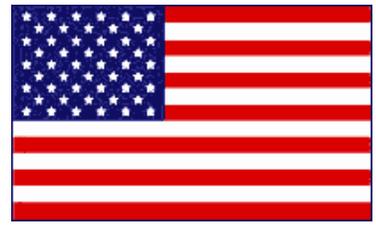

WHO MAY APPLY TO THIS ANNOUNCEMENT:

- Career or career conditional employees and permanent Title 38 employees and permanent Title 38 Hybrid employees of the Portland VA Medical Center eligible under the interchange Agreement. Included are permanent employees of the Willamette National Cemetery, Regional Office, Veterans Outreach Center and Veteran's Canteen.
- Career or career conditional employees and permanent Title 38 employees of other VA facilities.
- Applicants with competitive status outside the VA i.e., those with transfer or reinstatement eligibility.
- VEOA (Veterans Employment Opportunities Act) Veterans who are preference eligibles or who have been separated from the armed forces under honorable conditions after 3 or more years of continuous active service.
- **Noncompetitive Appointment of Certain Military Spouses**
 - Spouses of armed forces members who are involved in a Permanent Change of Station (PCS): You must include a copy of the service member's PCS Orders authorizing the spouse to accompany the service member and proof of marriage to the service member.
 - Spouses of armed forces members who retired or were released from active duty with a 100% disability: You must include proof that service member was released or discharged from active duty due to a service-connected disability, documentation of 100% disability, and proof of marriage to the service member.
 - Un-remarried widows or widowers of armed forces members killed while on active duty: You must include proof of service member's death while on active duty and proof of marriage to the service member.

Employees covered under the provision of the inter-agency Career Transition Plan (ICTAP) and Career Transition Assistance Plan (CTAP) (displaced VA Employees) eligibles will be given priority consideration for vacancies within the **local commuting area** for which they are well qualified. Applicants requesting this consideration must attach appropriate proof of the ICTAP eligibility with their application. Well qualified is defined as an applicant, without any further training, can perform the major duties of the position which include serving as the Senior Cytotechnologist in the Anatomic Pathology Section of the Laboratory Services with the responsibility for performing a full range of procedures including the cytodiagnosis of benign and malignant conditions as seen in sputum; respiratory, gastrointestinal, and urinary tract washings and brushings; urine, bodily fluids and cerebrospinal fluid; uterine, cervical, and vaginal smears; needle aspirations; and tumors and tissue imprints. The Senior Cytotechnologist will also identify all unusual findings in the preparations such as the presence of bacteria, fungi, viruses, yeasts, parasites and changes secondary to therapy, nutritional disorders, etc.

MAJOR DUTIES:

Incumbent serves as Senior Cytotechnologist in the Anatomic Pathology Section of the Laboratory Services of this University-affiliated Medical Center with the responsibility for performing a full range of procedures including the cytodiagnosis of benign and malignant conditions as seen in sputum; respiratory, gastrointestinal, and urinary tract washings and brushings; urine, bodily fluids and cerebrospinal fluid; uterine, cervical, and vaginal smears; needle aspirations; and tumors and tissue imprints. The Senior Cytotechnologist will identify all unusual findings in the preparations such as the presence of bacteria, fungi, viruses, yeasts, parasites and changes secondary to therapy, nutritional disorders, etc. The results of the work are used as a reference for continued patient screening, clinical diagnosis, therapeutic decision making and patient monitoring. Establishes and defines quality control procedures to determine accuracy of cytological diagnoses and quality and appropriateness of cytopreparatory techniques. Maintains cytotechnologist screening workload statistics and other workload data and prepares annual reports using the College of American Pathologists workload recording methods.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

Eligibility: U.S. Office of Personnel Management Qualification Standards Handbook for GS-0601, General Health Science applies and may be reviewed in the Human Resources Management Service office. Regulatory requirements such as "time-in-grade" and "time after competitive appointment" are applicable. You must meet both the basic requirement as well as the specialized experience requirement to qualify for this position.

Basic Requirements: Bachelors Degree: major study in an academic field related to the biological or life sciences Please submit a copy of your college transcripts with application packet.

Specialized Experience: One (1) year experience that equipped the applicant with the particular knowledge, skills, and abilities (KSA's) to perform successfully the duties of the position, and that is typically in or related to the work of the position to be filled. To be creditable, specialized experience must have been equivalent to at least the next lower grade level (GS-9). Specialized experience includes, but is not limited to work as a cytotechnologist in a hospital, medical center or clinic. Duties may have included, but are not limited to, performing a full range of procedures including the cytodiagnosis of benign and malignant conditions as seen in sputum; respiratory, gastrointestinal, and urinary tract washings and brushings; urine, bodily fluids and cerebrospinal fluid; uterine, cervical, and vaginal smears; needle aspirations; and tumors and tissue imprints. Duties may have also included identifying all unusual findings in the preparations such as the presence of bacteria, fungi, viruses, yeasts, parasites and changes secondary to therapy, nutritional disorders, etc.

Substitution of Education for Specialized Experience: Successful completion of three (3) years of progressively higher level graduate education leading to a Ph.D. degree or Ph.D. or equivalent doctoral degree can be substituted for the specialized experience. If using education as a substitute for experience, please submit a copy of your college transcripts with application packet.

BASIS OF RATING: (Knowledge, Skills, Abilities (KSAs))

On a separate sheet of paper, provide a written, detailed response to each of the KSAs. Failure to respond to the rating factors may result in your application receiving a less than desirable rating.

1. Professional knowledge of cytotechnology concepts, principles, practices, and methodologies including the use of statistics and quality assurance sufficient to perform a broad range of tests, including non-routine analysis.
2. Knowledge of body systems to facilitate evaluation of specimens obtained by a variety of techniques to include fine needle aspiration of major organ systems and subcutaneous masses.
3. Knowledge and skills to interpret the various clinical presentations of disease and apply such knowledge in conjunction with the microscopic findings to affect an appropriate and accurate final diagnosis.
4. Knowledge and skills sufficient to provide technical instructions and to advise other departments on problems related to cytologic techniques.
5. Knowledge of federal, VHA, and state laws and regulations, reference standards, medicolegal responsibilities, and certifying and accrediting agency requirements to insure that work is consistent with and meets all standards.
6. Ability to communicate effectively with fellow employees and patients. Demonstrates knowledge and skill in communication appropriate to the age of patients served.

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT:

Although the duty station is shown in this announcement, it may be necessary to utilize the selected person's services at a different location within the Portland VA Medical Center commuting area if conditions require it in the future Applicants without prior federal service will be appointed at step one of the grade

Eligible employees may be non-competitively reassigned to fill this position as an exception to merit promotion.

Under Executive Order 11935, only United States citizens and nationals (residents of American Samoa and Swains Island) may compete for civil service jobs. Agencies are permitted to hire noncitizens only in very limited circumstances where there are no qualified citizens available for the position.

If you are a male born after December 31, 1959, and are at least 18 years of age, civil service employment law (5 U.S.C. 3328) requires that you must register with the Selective Service System, unless you meet certain exemptions.

A security clearance and a favorable suitability determination are required. Misconduct in prior employment, criminal, dishonest or disgraceful conduct, habitual use of intoxicating beverages, abuse of narcotics, drugs or other controlled substances, or reasonable doubt of loyalty to the United States are examples of reasons an offer of employment may be denied.
