

WHO MAY APPLY TO THIS ANNOUNCEMENT:

Career or career conditional employees and permanent Title 38 and Title 38 Hybrid employees eligible under the interchange agreement and people eligible under special hiring authorities (See conditions of employment).
 ICTAP/CTAP eligible Federal Employees. (See conditions of employment).
 Noncompetitive appointment of certain military spouses. (See conditions of employment).
 VEOA (Veterans Employment Opportunity Act) eligible applicants (See conditions of employment).

MAJOR DUTIES:

This position is located in the Sterile Processing and Distribution (SPD) section of the VA Portland Medical Center, Portland, Oregon. As a Medical Supply Technician, you will be responsible for the Portland Veterans Affairs Medical Center for the overall preparation and assembly of reusable surgical instruments and equipment for a designated group of surgical specialties. Your duties include, but are not limited to, the following: Utilizes basic knowledge and understanding of aseptic principles, microbiology and medical procedures sufficient to understand the ways diseases and infections are transmitted. Maintains sterility of medical instruments and supplies; Conducts inventories utilizing bar code scanners; Disassembles supply items while avoiding damage and unnecessary wear; Removes gross contamination by soaking in a germicide, washing with a detergent-blood solvent, scrubbing with a brush and scouring powder, rinsing in tap and then distilled water or washing in a washer-sterilizer or ultrasonic unit; Decontaminates all reusable supplies and equipment; Visually examines items for damage, deterioration, or imperfections such as rust, pitting, and cracks; Packages individual items into sets, trays and case carts; Assembles both simple and complex surgical trays.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

Eligibility: U.S. Office of Personnel Management Qualification Standards Handbook for GS-622-5/6, Medical Supply Technician series applies and may be reviewed in the Human Resources Management Service office. Regulatory requirements such as "time-in-grade" and "time after competitive appointment" is applicable. Basic Requirements: Experience in processing, assembling, trouble-shooting, preparing, sterilizing, storing, and issuing sterile and unsterile medical supplies and equipment. The applicant must possess knowledge of the technical names, general uses, physical characteristics, and operating conditions of medical supply items; knowledge of decontamination, cleaning, preparation, sterilization, and storage procedures; knowledge of aseptic techniques; and skill in operating washer-sterilizer, ultrasonic instrument cleaners, and gas and steam sterilizers, Examples of qualifying specialized experience include work as an operation room technician, medical instrument technician, nursing assistant, corpsman, or laboratory worker.

General Experience: Experience in processing, assembling, trouble-shooting, preparing, sterilizing, storing, and issuing sterile and unsterile medical supplies and equipment. The applicant must possess knowledge of the technical names, general uses, physical characteristics, and operating conditions of medical supply items; knowledge of

decontamination, cleaning, preparation, sterilization, and storage procedures; knowledge of aseptic techniques; and skill in operating a washer-sterilizer, ultrasonic instrument cleaners, and gas and steam sterilizers. Examples of qualifying specialized experience include work as an operating room technician, medical instrument technician, nursing assistant, corpsman, or laboratory worker.

GS-5 Level: One year of experience that equipped the applicant with the particular knowledge, skills, and abilities (KSA's) to perform successfully the duties of the position, and that is typically in or related to the work of the position to be filled. To be creditable, specialized experience must have been equivalent to at least the next lower grade level. Duties may have included, but are not limited to, preparing case carts for surgery cases, assembling, evaluating, packaging and storing equipment; surgical instrument cleaning/decontamination, tray preparation, equipment maintenance, sterilization, and case cart assembly; decontaminating the full range of reusable medical supplies and equipment used in the Medical Center's wards and clinics in addition to the full spectrum of Surgical instrumentation and power tools; determining and using the appropriate method for removing gross contamination and eliminating pathogens; disassembling and reassembling equipment where the internal parts may become contaminated; operating various kinds of equipment such as ultrasonic cleaners, fiberoptic, plasma and gas sterilizers and associated devices; preparing a full range of reusable medical/ surgical supplies and equipment used throughout the Medical Center; removal of trays of instruments from pre-sterilization equipment; inspecting items to be sure that gross contamination has been removed and reassembling trays and sets based on recognition of key items or inventory needs; and collecting used equipment, selecting the proper method for removing gross contamination and disinfecting component parts, disassembling, cleaning reassembling and sterilizing in accordance with OSHA, AAMI, FDA, JCAHO and local requirements.

GS-6 Level: One year of experience that equipped the applicant with the particular knowledge, skills, and abilities (KSA's) to perform successfully the duties of the position, and that is typically in or related to the work of the position to be filled. To be creditable, specialized experience must have been equivalent to at least the next lower grade level. Duties may have included, but are not limited to, preparing case carts for surgery cases, assembling, evaluating, packaging and storing equipment; surgical instrument cleaning/decontamination, tray preparation, equipment maintenance, sterilization, and case cart assembly; decontaminating the full range of reusable medical supplies and equipment used in the Medical Center's wards and clinics in addition to the full spectrum of Surgical instrumentation and power tools; determining and using the appropriate method for removing gross contamination and eliminating pathogens; disassembling and reassembling equipment where the internal parts may become contaminated; operating various kinds of equipment such as ultrasonic cleaners, fiberoptic, plasma and gas sterilizers and associated devices; preparing a full range of reusable medical/ surgical supplies and equipment used throughout the Medical Center; removal of trays of instruments from pre-sterilization equipment; inspecting items to be sure that gross contamination has been removed and reassembling trays and sets based on recognition of key items or inventory needs; and collecting used equipment, selecting the proper method for removing gross contamination and disinfecting component parts, disassembling, cleaning reassembling and sterilizing in accordance with OSHA, AAMI, FDA, JCAHO and local requirements.

Substitution of Education for Experience: **GS-5:** Successful completion of a four year course of study above high school leading to a bachelor's degree with courses related to the occupation, if required. **GS-6:** Graduate education or internship meets the specialized experience required above the GS-5 only in those instances where it is directly related to the work of the position. One full year of graduate education that is directly related to the Medical Supply Technician position meets the requirements for GS-6. **If using education as a substitute for experience, please submit a copy of your college transcripts with application packet.**

BASIS OF RATING: (Knowledge, Skills, Abilities (KSAs))

On a separate sheet of paper, provide a written, detailed response to each of the KSAs. Failure to respond to the rating factors may result in your application receiving a less than desirable rating.

1. Knowledge of Medical Supplies and Equipment.
2. Knowledge of decontamination and aseptic techniques.
3. Ability to operate various equipments such as washer sterilizers, ultrasonic cleaners, and gas or steam sterilizers.
4. Knowledge of various cleaning agents and decontaminants.
5. Ability to properly store and pack medical instruments and equipment.

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT:

- **Priority Consideration:** Individuals who have special priority selection rights under the Agency Career Transition Assistance Program (CTAP) or the Interagency Career Transition Assistance Program (ICTAP) must be well qualified for the position to receive consideration for special priority selection. CTAP and ICTAP eligibles will be considered well qualified if they can perform the duties of the position at the full performance level and the full range employee benefits programs, union labor agreements, researching union cases, performance management and appraisal/award programs and policies.
- Federal Employees seeking CTAP/ICTAP eligibility must submit proof that they meet the requirements of 5 CFR 330.605 (a) for CTAP and 5 CFR 330.704 for ICTAP. This includes a copy of the agency notice, a copy of their most Abirecent Performance Rating and a copy of their most recent SF-50 noting current position, grade level, and duty location. Please annotate your application to reflect that you are applying as a CTAP or ICTAP eligible.
- **Noncompetitive Appointment of Certain Military Spouses**
 - Spouses of armed forces members who are involved in a Permanent Change of Station (PCS): You must include a copy of the service member's PCS Orders authorizing the spouse to accompany the service member and proof of marriage to the service member.
 - Spouses of armed forces members who retired or were released from active duty with a 100% disability: You must include proof that service member was released or discharged from active duty due to a service-connected disability, documentation of 100% disability, and proof of marriage to the service member.
 - Un-remarried widows or widowers of armed forces members killed while on active duty: You must include proof of service member's death while on active duty and proof of marriage to the service member.
- VEOA (Veterans Employment Opportunities Act) Veterans who are preference eligibles or who have been separated from the armed forces under honorable conditions after 3 or more years of continuous active service.
- Schedule A special hiring authority covers applicants with mental and physical disabilities. In order to be considered under this special hiring authority applicants need to provide proof of disability and job readiness certification. The proof of disability and job readiness certification can be provided by the following: 1) a statement or letter on a physician's/medical professional's letterhead; 2) statement, record or letter from a Federal Government agency that issues or provides disability benefits; 3) statement, record or letter from a State Vocational Rehabilitation Agency counselor; or 4) certification from a private Vocational Rehabilitation or other Counselor that issues or provides disability benefits. - VRA (Veterans Recruitment Act): VRA eligibility applies to the following categories: Disabled Veterans, Veterans who served on active duty in the Armed Forces during a war declared by Congress, or in a campaign or expedition for which a campaign badge has been authorized, Veterans who, while serving on active duty in the Armed Forces, participated in a military operation for which the Armed Forces Service Medal (AFSM) was awarded and Veterans separated from active duty within the past 3 years.
- Although the duty station is shown in this announcement, it may be necessary to utilize the selected person's services at a different location within the Portland VA Medical Center commuting area if conditions require it in the future Under Executive Order 11935, only United States citizens and nationals (residents of American Samoa and Swains Island) may compete for civil service jobs. Agencies are permitted to hire noncitizens only in very limited circumstances where there are no qualified citizens available for the position.
- If you are a male born after December 31, 1959, and are at least 18 years of age, civil service employment law (5 U.S.C. 3328) requires that you must register with the Selective Service System, unless you meet certain exemptions.
- A security clearance and a favorable suitability determination are required. Misconduct in prior employment, criminal, dishonest or disgraceful conduct, habitual use of intoxicating beverages, abuse of narcotics, drugs or other controlled substances, or reasonable doubt of loyalty to the United States are examples of reasons an offer of employment maybe denied.

APPLICANT'S PLEASE NOTE:
