MAJOR DUTIES: The incumbent serves as Human Resources Officer (Chief, Human Resources Management Service (HRMS) over a two-division Medical Center in two states, Oregon and Washington, specializing in acute, intermediate and long-term medical and surgical care, an outpatient clinic, geographically separate nursing home care unit, teaching and research facilities, and a VA cemetery, also geographically separate. The Chief, HRMS is a full staff official to the Director and Associate Director as a responsible partner of the executive management relationship with other staff officials in their personnel administrative specialty and is involved in the over-all deliberations of management concerning the objectives of management, and the ultimate mission-medical care of patients. Serves as the advisor and consultant to management. Consults and participates with all members of management in analyzing the broad implications of higher levels of authority, laws, regulations, policies, as well as technological and administrative advancement trends. Formulates and recommends personnel policies, and establishes and implements personnel activities, techniques and methods to assure sound, meaningful, and practical personnel administration in keeping with current and advanced concepts and objectives of personnel management. Works with operating officials or provides the staff assistance for mutually analyzing personnel problems and exploring possible solutions that will effectively contribute to the success of the organization's operating program.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- **Eligibility:** U.S. Office of Personnel Management [Qualification Standards](#) Handbook for GS-0201. Regulatory requirements such as "time-in-grade" and "time after competitive appointment" are applicable. **Time In Grade Requirements:** Applicants must have at least 52 weeks of service at the GS-12 grade level for GS-13 eligibility, OR 52 weeks of service at the GS13 grade level by the closing date of the announcement.
- **Basic Requirements:** Must be a U.S. citizen.
- **Specialized Experience:** At least one year of experience that equipped the applicant with the particular knowledge, skills, and abilities (KSA's) to perform successfully the duties of the position, and that is typically in or related to the

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position to be filled. To be creditable, specialized experience must have been equivalent to at least the next lower grade level. Specialized experience includes, but is not limited to; extensive knowledge and experience with Title 5 and Title 38 and Hybrid Title 38 Human Resource issues. Experience and knowledge of Employee Relations and Labor Relations issues as it pertains to Human Resources. Demonstrated experience working in a large organizational structure and acting as an advisor to varied supervisory and managerial levels on Human Resources issues. Experience developing new Human Resource models and implementing them at various levels and varied scales.

- Basis for Rating: Knowledge, Skills and Abilities

On a separate sheet of paper, provide a written, detailed response to each of the KSAs. Failure to respond to the rating factors may result in your application receiving a less than desirable rating.

1. Demonstrated knowledge and experience providing broad and authoritative guidance, management and leadership for a Human Resources program.
2. Ability to analyze long-range critical issues relating to Human Resources efficacy and develop comprehensive solutions and effect organizational improvements.
3. Ability to lead and provide effective HRM services to a variety of customer activities, and to integrate work efforts and negotiate acceptable solutions with those whose organizational goals and objectives may differ.
4. Skill in written communication sufficient to prepare and present findings to support actions regarding difficult human resources issues, develop training programs, and prepare technical reports, correspondence, policy statements and recommendations.
5. Ability to represent the medical center as the authoritative spokesperson in dealing with groups, supervisors, employee organizations, OPM and other agencies in a variety of matters ranging from case decisions to proposed personnel regulations and standards.
6. Ability to interpret and apply laws, regulations, and precedent decisions in order to provide authoritative guidance to executive management in all subject areas of human resources management.

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT:

- **Priority Consideration:** Individuals who have special priority selection rights under the Agency Career Transition Assistance Program (CTAP) or the Interagency Career Transition Assistance Program (ICTAP) must be well qualified for the position to receive consideration for special priority selection. CTAP and ICTAP eligibles will be considered well qualified if they can perform the duties of the position at the full performance level and the full range. Well qualified is defined as an individual with extensive practical and theoretical knowledge of all aspects of Human Resources Management Service (Recruitment & Placement, Employee and Labor Relations, Injury Management, Payroll and Security).

Federal Employees seeking CTAP/ICTAP eligibility must submit proof that they meet the requirements of 5 CFR 330.605 (a) for CTAP and 5 CFR 330.704 for ICTAP. This includes a copy of the agency notice, a copy of their most recent Performance Rating and a copy of their most recent SF-50 noting current position, grade level, and duty location. Please annotate your application to reflect that you are applying as a CTAP or ICTAP eligible.

- Noncompetitive Appointment of Certain Military Spouses

- Spouses of armed forces members who are involved in a Permanent Change of Station (PCS): You must include a copy of the service member's PCS Orders authorizing the spouse to accompany the service member and proof of marriage to the service member.

- Spouses of armed forces members who retired or were released from active duty with a 100% disability: You must include proof that service member was released or discharged from active duty due to a service-connected disability, documentation of 100% disability, and proof of marriage to the service member.

- Un-remarried widows or widowers of armed forces members killed while on active duty: You must include proof of service member's death while on active duty and proof of marriage to the service member.

- **VEOA (Veterans Employment Opportunities Act)** Veterans who are preference eligibles or who have been separated from the armed forces under honorable conditions after 3 or more years of continuous active service.

- **Schedule A** special hiring authority covers applicants with mental and physical disabilities. In order to be considered under this special hiring authority applicants need to provide proof of disability and job readiness certification. The proof of disability and job readiness certification can be provided by the following: 1) a statement or letter on a physician's/medical professional's letterhead; 2) statement, record or letter from a Federal Government agency that issues or provides disability benefits; 3) statement, record or letter from a State Vocational Rehabilitation Agency counselor; or 4) certification from a private Vocational Rehabilitation or other Counselor that issues or provides disability benefits. - **VRA (Veterans Recruitment Act):** VRA eligibility applies to the following categories: Disabled Veterans, Veterans who served on active duty in the Armed Forces during a war declared by Congress, or in a campaign or expedition for which a campaign badge has

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been authorized, Veterans who, while serving on active duty in the Armed Forces, participated in a military operation for which the Armed Forces Service Medal (AFSM) was awarded and Veterans separated from active duty within the past 3 years.

- Although the duty station is shown in this announcement, it may be necessary to utilize the selected person's services at a different location within the Portland VA Medical Center commuting area if conditions require it in the future
- Applicants without prior federal service will be appointed at step one of the grade
- Eligible employees may be non-competitively reassigned to fill this position as an exception to merit promotion.
- Under Executive Order 11935, only United States citizens and nationals (residents of American Samoa and Swains Island) may compete for civil service jobs. Agencies are permitted to hire noncitizens only in very limited circumstances where there are no qualified citizens available for the position.
- If you are a male born after December 31, 1959, and are at least 18 years of age, civil service employment law (5 U.S.C. 3328) requires that you must register with the [Selective Service](#) System, unless you meet certain exemptions.
- A security clearance and a favorable suitability determination are required. Misconduct in prior employment, criminal, dishonest or disgraceful conduct, habitual use of intoxicating beverages, abuse of narcotics, drugs or other controlled substances, or reasonable doubt of loyalty to the United States are examples of reasons an offer of employment may be denied.
- Public transit subsidy benefits are available. Carpooling assistance is provided. However, single occupancy parking is limited on main Portland campus.
- Relocation expenses may be authorized.
- Relocation incentive may be authorized.
- Recruitment incentive may be authorized.
- This is a developmental position. If selected below the target level, employee may be promoted without further competition upon satisfactory completion of qualification and eligibility requirements.
- Employee selected must serve a one (1) year probationary period for managers/supervisors as contained in 5 USC 315, unless she/he has already served the required supervisory period.
- Applicants appointed to direct patient care positions must be proficient in spoken and written English as required by 38 USC 7402(d) and 7407(d).
- This agency provides reasonable accommodations to applicants with disabilities. If you need a reasonable accommodation for any part of the application and hiring process, please notify the agency. The decision on granting reasonable accommodation will be on a case-by-case basis

7. Responses to the KSA's. Candidates are recommended to submit a narrative statement on a separate page(s) with specific responses to all of the knowledge, skills, and abilities (KSAs) in this announcement.
8. A copy of your college transcripts (Optional unless education is required). Please note, education must be accredited by an accrediting institution recognized by the U.S. Department of Education in order for it to be credited towards qualifications (particularly positions with a positive education requirement.). Therefore, applicants must report only attendance and/or degrees from schools accredited by accrediting institutions recognized by the U.S. Department of Education. All education claimed by applicants will be verified by the appointing agency accordingly.
