WHO MAY APPLY:

- Portland VA Medical Center career or career conditional employees and permanent Title 38 and Title 38 Hybrid employees eligible under the interchange agreement. (See conditions of employment).

BARGAINING UNIT POSITION: YES

MAJOR DUTIES: The Medical Supply Technician's position is located in the Sterile Processing Center with responsibilities exercised in all work areas within the section including patient care areas through the Medical Center. The incumbent will rotate among all of the various duty assignments which include, surgical instrument cleaning/decontamination, tray preparation, equipment maintenance, sterilization, and case cart assembly. In addition will decontaminate and prepare the full range of reusable medical supplies and equipment used in the Medical Center's wards and clinics in addition to the full spectrum of surgical instrumentation and power tools. Will select appropriate methods for sterilizing and will collect used equipment, while selecting the proper methods of removing gross contamination and disinfect parts.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- **Eligibility:** U.S. Office of Personnel Management [Qualification Standards](#) Handbook for GS-0622. Regulatory requirements such as "time-in-grade" and "time after competitive appointment" are applicable.
- **Basic Requirements:** Must be a U.S. citizen.
- **Specialized Experience:** At least one year of experience equivalent to the GS-4 level for the GS-5. At least one year of experience equivalent to the GS-5 level for the GS-6. This experience will have equipped the applicant with the particular knowledge, skills, and abilities (KSA's) to perform successfully the duties of the position, and that is typically in or related to the position to be filled. To be creditable, specialized experience must have been equivalent to at least the next lower grade level. Specialized experience includes, but is not limited to; experience in processing, assembling, trouble-shooting, preparing, sterilizing, storing, and issuing sterile and unsterile medical supplies and equipment. The applicant must possess knowledge of the technical names, general uses, physical characteristics, and operating conditions of medical supply items; knowledge of decontamination, cleaning, preparation, sterilization, and storage procedures; knowledge of aseptic techniques; and skill in operating a washer-sterilizer, ultrasonic instrument cleaners, and gas and steam sterilizers. Examples of qualifying specialized experience include work as an operating room technician, medical instrument technician, etc.
- **Substitution of Education for Experience:** At the GS-5 level only: 4-year course of study above high school leading to a bachelor's degree with courses related to the occupation. This education must have been obtained in an accredited business, secretarial or technical school, junior college, college or university. One year of full-time academic study is defined as 30 semester hours, 45 quarter hours, or the equivalent in a college or university, or at least 20 hours of classroom instruction per week for approximately 36 weeks in a business, secretarial, or technical school. Applicant must submit copy of transcripts with application to receive credit for substitution.
- **Basis for Rating: Knowledge, Skills and Abilities**
On a separate sheet of paper, provide a written, detailed response to each of the KSAs. Failure to respond to the rating factors may result in your application receiving a less than desirable rating.
 1. Knowledge of Medical Supplies and Equipment.

Please note: It is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure timely receipt of the application, regardless of the method used for submission. 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2. Knowledge of decontamination and aseptic techniques.
3. Ability to operate various equipment such as washer sterilizers, ultrasonic cleaners, and gas or steam sterilizers.
4. Knowledge of various cleaning agents and decontaminants.
5. Ability to properly store and pack medical instruments and equipment.

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT:

- Although the duty station is shown in this announcement, it may be necessary to utilize the selected person's services at a different location within the Portland VA Medical Center commuting area if conditions require it in the future
- Eligible employees may be non-competitively reassigned to fill this position as an exception to merit promotion.
- Public transit subsidy benefits are available. Carpooling assistance is provided. However, single occupancy parking is limited on main Portland campus.
- This is a developmental position. If selected below the target level, employee may be promoted without further competition upon satisfactory completion of qualification and eligibility requirements.
- A drug test may be required for an applicant who is tentatively selected.
- A pre-employment physical examination will be required for an applicant who is tentatively selected.
- Applicants appointed to direct patient care positions must be proficient in spoken and written English as required by 38 USC 7402(d) and 7407(d).
