

WHO MAY APPLY TO THIS ANNOUNCEMENT:

- Career or career conditional employees and permanent Title 38 employees and permanent Title 38 Hybrid employees of the **VA Northwest Health Network (VISN 20)** eligible under the interchange Agreement. Included are permanent employees in VISN 20 area working in National Cemeteries, Regional Office, Veterans Outreach Centers and Veteran's Canteens.
- Career or career conditional employees and permanent Title 38 employees of other VA facilities and permanent Title 38 Hybrid employees eligible under the interchange Agreement of their facilities.
- Applicants with competitive status outside the VA i.e., those with transfer or reinstatement eligibility.
- Veterans who are preference eligibles or who have been separated from the armed forces under honorable conditions after 3 or more years of continuous active service.
- Employees covered under the provision of the inter-agency Career Transition Plan (ICTAP) and Career Transition Assistance Plan (CTAP) (displaced VA Employees) eligibles will be given priority consideration for vacancies within the **local commuting area** for which they are well qualified. Applicants requesting this consideration must attach appropriate proof of the ICTAP eligibility with their application.

MAJOR DUTIES:

Incumbent serves as the entry person to assist transitioning Operation Iraqi Freedom/Operation Enduring Freedom (OIF/OEF) veterans. Many of these veterans suffer from multiple complex health and mental health problems, including traumatic brain injury, amputations, burns, combat stress and post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and this position is dedicated to ensuring severely injured service members and veterans have a personal advocate as they move through the VA system. Incumbent will travel to DOD medical treatment facility and will personally escort disabled veteran to VA Medical Center. Incumbent provides coordination of care, advisory and technical assistance to OIF/OEF veterans seeking medical care. Incumbent is responsible to provide advice on eligibility in the VA system and assist with facilitating all aspects of care required/requested by the OIF/OEF veterans in collaboration with Social Work and Nursing Case Managers. Incumbent independently handles a wide range of difficult contacts and complex situations, including eligibility determination on all types of patients. He/she supports the administration and clinical staff relating to administration eligibility matters. As directed by the OIF/OEF Program Manager, contacts the gaining or appropriate nationwide VAMC facility for the given patient and transfers enrollment and clinical records as part of the transition assistant. Incumbent utilizes Appointment Management in VISTA and the Computerized Patient Record System (CPRS) on a routine basis to monitor appointment timeliness and ensure care is not lost to follow-up. These positions are assigned within VISN 20 and the employee may work virtually from a VA Medical Center.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

Eligibility: U.S. Office of Personnel Management Qualification Standards Handbook for GS-301 series applies and may be reviewed in the Human Resources Management Service office. Regulatory requirements such as "time-in-grade" and "time after competitive appointment" are applicable.

Specialized Experience: Applicants must have at least one (1) year of specialized experience that equipped the applicant with particular knowledge, skills, and abilities (KSA's) to perform successfully the duties of the position, and that is typically in or related to the position to be filled. To be creditable, specialized experience must have been equivalent to at least 1 year at

the GS-9 level in the Federal Service for the GS-11 level.

Substitution of Education for Experience: **GS-9:** Master's or equivalent graduate degree or 2 full years of progressively higher level graduate education leading to such a degree or LL.B. or J.D., if related. **GS-11:** Ph.D. or equivalent doctoral degree or 3 full years of progressively higher-level graduate education leading to such a degree or LL.M. If related If using education as a substitute for experience, please submit a copy of your college transcripts with application packet.

BASIS OF RATING: (Knowledge, Skills, Abilities (KSAs))

On a separate sheet of paper, provide a written, detailed response to each of the KSAs. Failure to respond to rating factors will result in applicant not being referred for the position:

1. Experience working with combat veterans and the complex issues surrounding the OIF/OEF veterans and the mandates and timelines on processing this unique group of patients (please describe in detail your experiences that have given you this expertise.)
2. Knowledge of all eligibility including medical and dental outpatient, hospitalization, prosthetics, Fee Basis and prescriptions.

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT:

Although the duty station is shown in this announcement, it may be necessary to utilize the selected person's services at a different location within the VISN 20 commuting area if conditions require it in the future

Eligible employees may be non-competitively reassigned to fill this position as an exception to merit promotion.
