Why are monetary donations important?

The Veteran's Memorial Museum is a non-profit institute dedicated to inspiring and educating future generations, preserving famous artifacts historical, and honoring the patriotic service of our veterans.

How will my donation be used?

You are free to specify the project towards which your gift will be used; general programs and operations, educational programs, aircraft acquisition and preservation, library and archives, new exhibits, or others. If you do not specify a project, the museum board will determine how the gift can be used for the greatest good.

Is my donation tax deductible?

Because the museum is equivalent to a 501c3 entity, your donation is tax deductible. The amount of your deduction may depend upon your particular financial circumstances. We recommend you consult your tax advisor for details on how the donation may affect your tax situation.

Gifts and donations constitute a supplemental source of funding to the Portland VA Medical Center. All donations are put into the General Post Fund (GPF). The General Post Fund is trust fund authorized by Title 26, United States Code, Section 1321. A gift to a GPF account administered by the Department of Veterans Affairs is a charitable contribution as defined by the Internal Revenue Code, Section 170 ©, and is tax deductible to the same extent as a gift made a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organization. 100% of your donation will be used for the benefit of our Veterans.

How can I make a donation?

The museum accepts monetary donations in the form of cash, checks, stocks, and bonds. The museum is also thankful to those who have included it in their wills and charitable remainder trusts.
