## VOLUNTEER PROFILES

### Marilyn James



In early 1964, the Clark County chapter of the American Red Cross directed Marilyn James to the Vancouver VA Medical Center where she was assigned to Occupational Therapy. At that time, the department occupied some of the old-style WWII barracks building, just down the hall from the old Theatre and Voluntary Service. It offered varied activities for the hospitalized veterans, such as ceramics, loom weaving and leatherwork.

Marilyn was a welcome and valuable addition to OT and she still is, forty-two years later. OT is now quartered in Building D-7 and its focus now is the rehabilitation of stroke patients and those who have lost limbs. These activities handled by trained staff personnel while Marilyn fills an important need in the department by making wheelchair gloves. From whole animal hides that are donated by several service organizations.

Marilyn cuts out the glove parts in sizes S, M, L, and XL, and then sews them together on a heavy-duty sewing machine. She also sews rice and gel packs that

are used in therapy and wash mitts that hold a bar of soap and make showering much easier for the patient.

Marilyn is a native of Marietta, Ohio, but she grew up in several Ohio locales because of their father's work in the newspaper business. They were in Cleveland when Marilyn graduated from high school. After working as a clerk/typist at Wright-Patterson AFB in Dayton, Ohio, satisfied her sense of adventure by moving to Los Angeles where a girl friend was living and working. In LA she worked for the Social Security Administration and in a chance encounter, met Jack James who was attending Art school under the GI Bill after WWII Army service in Europe and the South Pacific. They were married in Los Angeles and after a short time, moved to Spokane, Jack's home-town. A job offer in Seattle from Cudahy Bar-S, a meat packing company, brought them west of the Cascades. The position as Advertising Manager gave Jack the opportunity to use his considerable artistic talent. They moved to Vancouver when Bar-S transferred Jack to the Portland office in 1961.

Marilyn lives in the home they bought in 1964 in the Leveich Park area. The walls are hung with Jack's beautiful art. A well-known artist in this area, his favorite media were watercolor and scratchboard, with nature a favorite subject. Marilyn and Jack had been married 49 years when he died in 1997. Their two sons, one grand-son, two grand-daughters and love

great-grandchildren all live in Vancouver.

Marilyn has been a member of the Fraternal Order of Eagles for twenty-five years. She loves to spend time in her yard and garden and it shows. Her backyard is lush, green grass and flowers; the front yard, a Japanese-style rock garden designed and built by one of her grand-daughters. The home is on a quiet dead-end street, close to a former hazel-nut orchard where birds abound, and Marilyn delights in feeding them. Publication dealing with birds and flowers are her favorite reading material.

This gentle, gracious and skilled lady has served our veterans for over 40 years on a weekly basis, with time out only during the summers of her son's growing-up years and during the winters of their husband's retirement years. It was then they traveled to Mesa, Arizona, where they enjoyed the sunshine and Jack painted. In OT, a department that has seen few volunteers, she has continued to volunteer because she enjoys her work there and the people. She is still in contact with some of the former staff members she met there. Although she did not work directly with veterans, the knowledge that she was providing them with a real service gave her a great sense of satisfaction.

Marilyn says that she is "gradually retiring from the VA," so we are just in time to salute her for her 42 years of devoted volunteer service here at Vancouver VAMC. Thank you, Marilyn.



## Volunteer Profiles

### Sheryl Stockton Volunteer Craft Coordinator

Sherry and her husband Craig came to the Liver/Kidney Transplant lodging unit in Vancouver at the end of May from Hemet, California near the Loma Linda VA area.

Between them they have 3 children and 6 grandchildren their ages ranging 5 months to 16 years.

When they arrived at the Liver/Kidney Transplant lodging unit, Sherry brought a truck load of crafts to keep herself busy during the time they would be waiting for Craig's transplant. Her family, knowing Sherry the way they did, laughed at her because she packed all her craft items before packing her clothing. Some of the projects she brought were: jewelry making, gourds, and scrapbooks.

The moment she started unloading her truck, the patients



and caregivers became curious about all the items she was bringing inside. Having been at the lodging unit for the grand opening, Sherry knew there was an area designed for hobbies and

crafts that had not yet been set up. With Sherry's craft items the room took shape.

As she began working on her gourds, caregivers and veterans came into the new craft room. Making the gourds took

some coaxing because it appeared to be difficult but the project turned out to be easier than what everyone thought. The women enjoyed the carving and the men seemed to enjoy the detail of the wood burning.

While patients have been recovering at the lodging unit, Sherry has taught some of the caregivers how to make scrapbooks of their experiences during their stay. Sherry however, has not been able to get any of her own scrapbooking or other crafts done because she has been so willing to help others with their projects. It makes her feel good knowing that these projects help reduce the stress people experience while undergoing this challenging experience.

When patients or caregivers have problems sleeping at night and/or in the early mornings you will probably find them working on various projects in the craft room. The room is also used for crafts such as: models, bead art, paint by number kits and leather



crafts donated by "Help Hospitalized Vets". Originally Sherry thought that doing crafts would be just for fun but soon realized there was a huge need for ways to help veterans relieve stress and to focus on other things.

Sherry is concerned that when she goes home the craft program will not continue. She has donated hundreds of dollars and hours for the projects, and continues to help people who live at the lodging unit who are unable to purchase supplies.

Sherry plans to leave all her supplies in the craft room when she leaves so they may inspire the patients and caregivers to try out new hobbies. Sherry is so caring towards everyone with whom she comes in contact that it is a wonder she makes time for herself. Sherry Stockton is an example of one of our finest volunteers who puts great meaning behind the slogan "Putting Veterans first". We would like to thank her for all her hard work and big heart.

### Richard Campbell



Richard was born in South Carolina and traveled as a young boy while his father was in the military. He graduated from high school in Connecticut and immediately joined the Army; he was stationed in Germany for 21/2 years. After he got out of the Army he spent most of his life working in construction and doing ranch work. Richard has a horse ranch in Colorado where he trains and shoes horses as well as doing seasonal work with other ranches in the area.

Two years ago he was at a High Country Cow Camp when he became very ill and had to return home. He went to the emergency room and was told that he had end stage liver disease and that having a liver transplant would be his only option. Throughout the evaluation process Richard had been hospitalized many times. He had been at the Liver/Kidney Transplant Lodging Unit in Vancouver off and on since June 2005.

The Lodging Unit is the only one of its kind in the nation and houses 30 patients and caregivers.

Richard became like a family member to those who knew him here at the Vancouver Division medical center. He became acquainted with Voluntary Service and volunteers and learned he could be provided with crafts and comfort needs. Richard constructed a variety of models and felt that it

really helped him manage stress and deal with, what seemed like, the endless wait for his transplant.

Richard wrote a letter expressing his appreciation and wanted to recognize the Volunteer Organizations, Help Hospitalized Veterans and Voluntary Service for their efforts and kindness through this experience. Not only did the

Richard has since received his new liver and now is on the road to recovery

## PORTLAND AND VANCOUVER NEWS

### Veterans Guest Shuttle Cart Program

The Veterans Guest Shuttle Cart Program began in Vancouver in 2001. At that time, we had eight volunteer drivers who committed to driving one day a week, with one or two volunteers in reserve. As the program developed, it was obvious that driving an eight-hour shift for these older, retired and working, volunteers was going to be a little too much. The Director of the VAVS designated a Coordinator to design a more efficient system for the cart program and begin to record and report the activities in an effort to improve the service to our Veterans.

It wasn't known how popular the program would be or how long it would last. The pro-

gram began at the Vancouver Division Medical Center and, shortly thereafter, included a few volunteers at the Portland VA Medical Center. The Portland group is developing at a slower pace, due to parking issues and volunteer participation.

At first, we were quite pleased to realize the transporting of around 1,000 passengers a month. After fine-tuning the program several times and adjusting the scheduling to accommodate more drivers, we now enjoy an average monthly passenger count that averages 3,000-4,000. The total count for the first eight months of 2006 is 24,020. Veterans who visit the Clinic in Vancouver have praised the program.

Currently we have 21 volunteers signed up for the program- 16 are scheduled on a regu-

lar basis, some on alternate weeks, and others on an "each week" basis. We also have three or four volunteers who are on an emergency list for filling in for those who can't make their regular scheduled shift. During the five years of operation, we have had about 42 volunteers for the program.

All drivers are proud and happy to be serving our Veterans.




## RECIPES

### Strawberry Cheesecake Quesadillas

#### INGREDIENTS

- 4 (8 inch) flour tortilla
- 2 tablespoons softened cream cheese
- 2 tablespoons strawberry jam
- 1 tablespoon confectioners' sugar



#### DIRECTIONS


1. Spread one side of 2 tortillas with 1/2 the cream cheese. Spread equal amounts jam over cream cheese. Spread remaining 2 tortillas with remaining cream cheese, and place on top of first 2 tortillas to form quesadillas.
2. Place quesadillas in a skillet sprayed with cooking spray over medium heat and cook 5 minutes on each side, until golden brown. Serve sprinkled with confectioners' sugar.

### Spinach Cheese Ball

#### INGREDIENTS

- 1 (10 ounce) package frozen chopped spinach, thawed and squeezed dry
- 2 (8 ounce) packages cream cheese, softened
- 1 (4 ounce) can water chestnuts, drained and chopped
- 1 (.4 ounce) packet dry vegetable soup mix
- 2 tablespoons mayonnaise
- 1 cup finely shredded Cheddar cheese
- 1/2 cup chopped walnuts



#### DIRECTIONS

1. In a large bowl, mix together the spinach, cream cheese, water chestnuts, vegetable soup mix, mayonnaise and Cheddar cheese until well blended. Form into a ball, and roll in chopped walnuts. If the mixture is too soft to form a ball, refrigerate for about 30 minutes to set. Wrap the cheese ball in plastic wrap, and refrigerate overnight to blend the flavors before serving with your favorite crackers

## RECIPES

### No Bake Cookies

#### INGREDIENTS

- 1 3/4 cups white sugar
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1/2 cup butter
- 4 tablespoons unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1/2 cup crunchy peanut butter
- 3 cups quick-cooking oats
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract



\*\* Note: For a low sugar recipe, substitute regular sugar with Splenda or only add 3/4 cup of regular-sugar and increase the crunchy peanut butter to 3/4 cup.

#### DIRECTIONS

In a medium saucepan, combine sugar, milk, butter, and cocoa. Bring to a boil, and cook for 1 1/2 minutes. Remove from heat, and stir in peanut butter, oats, and vanilla. Drop by teaspoonfuls onto wax paper. Let cool until hardened.

### **INFORMATION YOU NEED TO KNOW:**

Voluntary Service needs an accurate total of volunteered hours. The hours that you volunteer need to be entered the day that you worked, by entering your hours on that day you will be protecting your rights under the Federal Tort Claims Protection Act.

Because VA cannot be the responsible for volunteer work that takes place away from the medical center, the service cannot accept any hours unless they were volunteered at a VA site.

Three exceptions to the rule above.

- DAV Transportation drivers are allowed to clock time from the moment they leave their designated city

in the morning until they return home that evening.

- The Chief of Voluntary Service has authority to allow volunteers to receive hours while working away from the VA site in special circumstances.
- Volunteers with Community Service assignments, such as visiting at a nursing home, may receive credit for their hours (providing job assignments are in the volunteers' file).

There are five ways to have your volunteer hours counted:

1. Sign in on the VSS computer located in the Voluntary Service Workroom.

2. Report on a donation sheet
3. Write a note and include the date you volunteered. Mail to: Department of Veterans Affairs, P-5-VOL, 3710 SW US Veterans Hospital Road, PO Box 1035, Portland, OR 97239.
