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
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

How Stress Can Follow You Home

Combat stress can impact a Veteran's daily life in many ways and impede their interactions with colleagues, friends, and family.

Stress may cause a Veteran to feel hostile or angry. It can also lead to sleeplessness and can even prevent a Veteran from connecting emotionally with others. In addition, stress can negatively impact a Veteran's professional life; stressed individuals often fatigue more easily, have difficulty concentrating and miss work more frequently.

If you feel that you may be experiencing symptoms related to combat stress or military sexual trauma, please contact your nearest VA health care facility.

Our Promise to You: Five Years of Free Health Care

Eligible returning service members have five years from their date of discharge to receive free VA health care for any combat-related condition. Some of the many services that the VA offers Veterans include:
